The primary aim of the course is to provide a basic knowledge of the civil law regulation and fundamental principles that guide the operation in the civil law area. The course is designed, as much as possible, to resemble a second-year course taught at a Polish administration school. Upon completion of this course the student should have an understanding of the legal terms and principles and the basic civil law rules governing in Poland in the areas of operation of agreements, real estate, matrimonial regimes and successions.

Introduction and overview; definition of the civil law; sources of law in Poland; legislation, custom, judicial decisions, works of legal scholars</li> <li>2. Division of the Polish Civil Code</li> <li>3. The general principles of the civil law.</li> <li>4. Natural Persons; Capacity to hold rights, commencement and termination of personality, protection of personality. Legal entities, categories, formal requirements, personality, liability; rights, definition, abuse of rights. Legal bodies without legal personality.</li> <li>5. Juridical act, definition, capacity, vices of consent, form, formation of contracts, consideration and cause, content, nullities, interpretation; offer and acceptance, terminology, duration of offer, revocation, method of signifying acceptance.</li> <li>6. Property, things (definition, division), possession, ownership (acquisition, protection), servitudes (predial &amp; personal), recordation, real security rights, mortgage and lien.</li> <li>7. Law of obligations (General Part); Obligation, definition, sources, performance</li> </ol>	

8. Contractual Obligations; non-performance of obligations, claim to performance in kind impossibility – delay – other cases of breach of contract-default; contractual rescission; extinction of obligations: fulfilment, set-off, assignment of claims, assumption of debt, joint and several obligations;
9. Basic types of contracts; general principles of contract of sale and lease, donation.
10. Non-contractual obligations. Unlawful acts (tort liability, strict liability, consequences, remedies, prescription, mass torts) Unjust enrichment.
11. Family Law. Legal protection for the family and its members.
12. Marital Law, State Regulation of Entry into the Marital Relationship,
13. Divorce, Separation agreements,
14. Marital Property regimes, Child Custody.
15. Law of succession, testate and intestate succession, wills, formal and essential validity, intestate succession, rights attaching successions.
